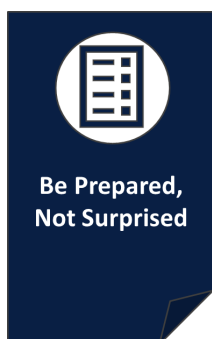

Process for Assessing and Optimizing Chemical Preparedness: DHS Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Office (CWMD) partners with state, local, tribal, and territorial (SLTT) stakeholders to enhance local preparedness for chemical incidents. ChemPREP considers each participating local jurisdiction's unique chemical threats and vulnerabilities, assesses their ability to respond, recommends actions to enhance their readiness, and seeks to connect them with other federal resources to improve coordination and overall preparedness.
